

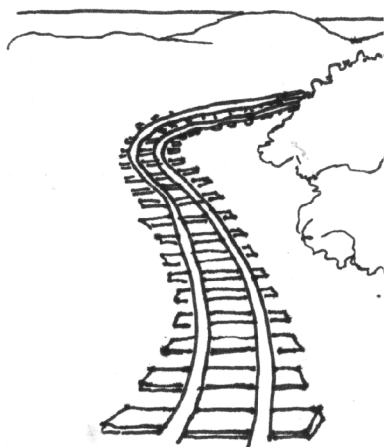
JOIN THE FIGHT AGAINST NEUROENDOCRINE CANCER

Neuroendocrine tumours (NETS) are the fastest growing class of cancers worldwide. NETS is an umbrella term for a group of unusual, often slow-growing cancers most commonly found in the gastrointestinal system, pancreas or lungs. By the time the cancer is diagnosed it may have spread, and conventional cancer treatments are often not effective. More research is needed.
